PROGRAM OVERVIEW

OF HISTORY SCHOOL PROGRAMS

The Canadian Museum of History offers meaningful learning experiences designed to support teachers in providing exceptional history education. Based on the principles of critical thinking, these programs provide access to material history, problem-solving activities and creative opportunities for students to communicate their findings. Museums share history through the stories they tell, and these programs aim at ensuring that your students come away with a greater understanding of the human stories behind historical events.

Our four programming formats offer you and your students a wide range of learning experiences in a variety of environments. Each of these programming formats – described below – emphasizes core competencies such as teamwork, problem-solving and critical thinking skills, and accommodates visual, kinesthetic and auditory learning styles.

WORKSHOPS: These 45-minute hands-on sessions are held in one of the Museum's ateliers, where students investigate a "big idea" using primary and secondary sources (archival images, replica artifacts and living history collections).

IN-GALLERY EXPLORATIONS:


In these 45-minute facilitated gallery visits, students examine a specific question related to the main message of the gallery you've chosen, using replica artifacts, props and activity cards.


GALLERY ACTIVITY SHEETS:

The Museum is open every day from 9:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. throughout the school year, and Thursdays to 8 p.m. For information on seasonal variations of our hours of operation, please call 819-776-7014 or 1-800-555-5621, or check our website. Please note that the Museum will be closed from January 4 to 8, 2016 for annual maintenance.



ARRIVAL

We recommend that your group arrive a minimum of 20 minutes before the scheduled start of your program. If you arrive at the Museum late, we cannot guarantee your reserved program or tour. In the event of inclement weather or other unexpected delays, please call en route to advise our Call Centre at 819-776-7014 or 1-800-555-5621. Once your group is at the Group Entrance, please have your head representative check in at the Group Entrance counter. Students will receive a brief welcome and overview of the Museum rules before proceeding with their visit or program.



ADULT SUPERVISION

Teachers and parent helpers have an important role to play. We rely on your support to keep the group together during your program or tour, to solve any discipline problems that may arise and to participate in smaller group work. Supervision ratios vary, depending on age group and location of your visit.

Note: Adult chaperones (within the obligatory ratio) pay the group student rate. Any additional adults pay the regular group adult rates.

BOOKING YOUR VISIT

- The group rates apply to groups of 20 people or more.
- When buying a combination that includes activities at the Canadian Museum of History and the Canadian War Museum, the tickets are valid for three consecutive days - starting on the day of the first visit.
- Each combination applies to a single group. They cannot be separated and are nontransferable.
- Admission to all special exhibitions and the Children's Museum is included in general admission to Museums.
- A minimum of 20 people is required for CINÉ+ film presentations outside of the regular CINÉ+ schedule.
- The Museum (and Children's Museum) can be very busy in May and June. We highly recommend that you reserve your program in advance. If attendance is high, groups without a reservation may not be permitted access.
