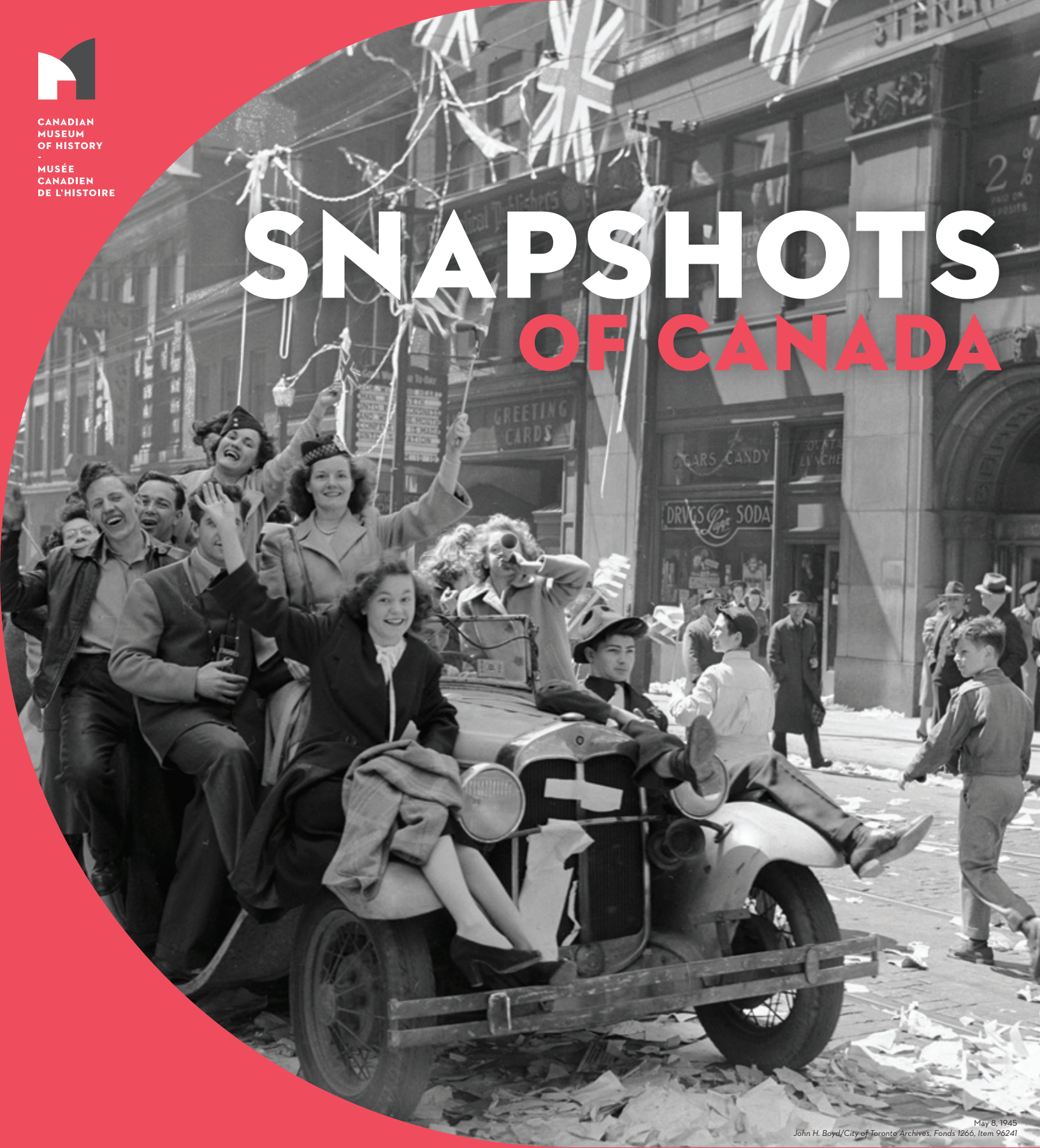

### **ABOUT THE PARTNERSHIP**

This travelling exhibition was developed in partnership  
with Canada's History Society, a not-for-profit organization  
with a mission to make discovery of this country's past  
relevant, engaging, empowering and accessible to  
all Canadians.

### **THEMES**

- Building a Country
- Living Together
- Seeking Justice
- Celebrating Culture

### **CONTENT**

- 50 graphic wall panels each featuring a photo and author's commentary.
- 6 free-standing graphic panels.

### **REQUIRED EXHIBITION SPACE**

60 linear metres minimum (200 linear feet minimum).

### **AVAILABILITY**

2017-2020 (minimum 12-week rental).

### **LOAN FEE**

\$3,000<sup>1</sup>, transportation included<sup>2</sup>.

The borrower must provide insurance for the total value  
of the exhibition.

### **SECURITY**

- Human or electronic surveillance, 24 hours a day.
- Human surveillance during loading and unloading of cases, and during installation and dismantling of the exhibition.
