










Instructions: Draw a line from the object to the correct materials used to make it.

Additional information for teachers:

Toy rocking chair, artifact 87-96.2
 This wooden toy rocking chair is of French-Canadian origin.

Doll, artifact 58-49
 This French Canadian Doll is made of multicolored wool, with crochet-made clothing.

Rocking horse, artifact 77-885
 This French Canadian double rocking horse is made of unpainted, plain pine.

Basket, artifact III-H-344
 This birch bark basket of Huron-Wendat origin is made from a single piece of bark folded together at the ends. A spruce root handle is tied to the two folded ends.

Moccasins, artifact III-I-539 a,b
 These leather moccasins are from the Iroquois of the Northeastern Woodlands

Doll jacket, artifact 75-76.2
 This French Canadian hand-sewn doll's jacket is made of wool and linen. Linen is made from the fibres of the flax plant.
