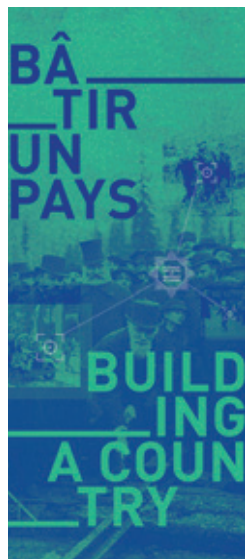
SNAPSHOTS OF CANADA
